Herbert Hoover's full name was Herbert Clark Hoover. He was born on August 10, 1874, and Died on October 20, 1964. Herbert Hoover's Early Life

Herbert Hoover was born in a Quaker Family in West Branch, Iowa, at the home of a blacksmith. He was brought up in Oregon. He was admitted to **Stanford University in 1991**. When it opened, he was 1 graduate of the university in geology (1895) and moved towards a mining engineering career. Herbert Hoover threw himself completely as he rounded the world in search of mineral deposits and established businesses to deal with valuable mining resources. His deep research and implementation paid off; in reverse, he became the richest person. Counted his name in top millionaires.

President Herbert Hoover also worked as secretary of commerce under presidents Warren G. Harding and Calvin Coolidge. He worked like a domain member, not actively involved, and basically worked from backstage to properly regulate the work front stage. He won the 1928 republican election against the Democratic candidate by giving them a terrible defeat, said like to humble to the dust. And became the president of the country in 1929.

In 1929, the period was of economic crisis; the stock market crashed, but he smartly handled the situation by Implementing a sequence of economic measures to bolster the economy. During the depression, he sought to address economic challenges, and, as a result, around one million Mexican



Americans were encouraged to return to Mexico in a campaign referred to as the Mexican Repatriation. Some scholars suggest that this campaign, viewed through a modern lens, raises important questions about historical treatment and displacement.

It is said that everyone's time comes, and it is true that the first Hover defeated a Democratic Candidate terribly; the same happened with Hoover. In the 1932 election, in the middle of the economic crisis. A democratic party member defeated Hoover, and he had to leave the presidency in 1933. But he was strong as a backup

As a matter of course, he had to leave his chair, but his retirement was the longest for more than 31 years. This means he will not be on the president's chair, but he will still enjoy all the facilities a president should get. Following that, he wrote many series and became conservative in retirement. He criticized Roosevelt's actions and foreign policies. In 1940 and 1950, he successfully changed the public's perspective.

At one time, the public was in favor of him. He showed the various projects he had done for presidents **Harry S. Truman** and <u>Dwight D. Eisenhower</u>, including chairing the influential Herbert Hoover Commission. But he remained unsuccessful in winning the hearts of Political scientists and Historians. They gave him a low rank in the presidency and considered him a below-average President. But still, Hoover was appreciated as a Humanitarian and Public Official.

He earned prosperity and money throughout his life. He was rich, not just by money. He was a precedent of humanity. He was born in the west branch. Iowa. Because he was born into a Quaker family and his father was a blacksmith. The earnings were just like hand-to-mouth. Therefore, for him, his real wealth was at the beginning of his life, relying on the values provided to him by his community.


