### Who was Jodha Bai

**Jodha Bai** or **Mariam-Uz-Zamani** was the daughter of **Raja Bharmal of Amer (Jaipur)**. Properly known as **Jodha Bai, Mariam Uz Zamani** was born on October 1, 1542. She was a Hindu Princess but married a Muslim king Akbar. Their marriage was considered to be an example of religious tolerance. Mariam-uz-Zamani was referred to as the **Queen Mother of Hindustan** during the **reign of the Mughal Akbar** and also during her son Emperor. Jodha Bai was the longest-serving Hindu [Mughal Empress](#). Her tenure lasted for over 43 years. **Jodha Bai is known as Akbar's first and last love.**

## Jodha Bai and Akbar the Great



**Raja Bharmal** considered **Akbar** weak and declared war against him, which was the biggest mistake Raja Bharmal. In return, **Akbar ordered his brother-in-law Sharifuddin to attack Amer**. And **Sharifuddin Conquered Amer** in a few days. Raja Bharmal apologized and requested to rule Amer under the [Mughals](#), in return, Bharmal offered Akbar the marriage of his daughter Jodha Bai, which Akbar accepted. Marriage between Muslim rulers and the daughters of Hindus is unusual. Mariam uz Zamani, popularly known as Jodha, created history by becoming the **FIRST WOMAN** in the world annals of medieval history to keep her culture, traditions, religion, and maternal. Mariam-uz-Zamani is known as “a great adventurer” and as a woman of high spirit with a taste for the unusual.

## Jodha Bai Sons

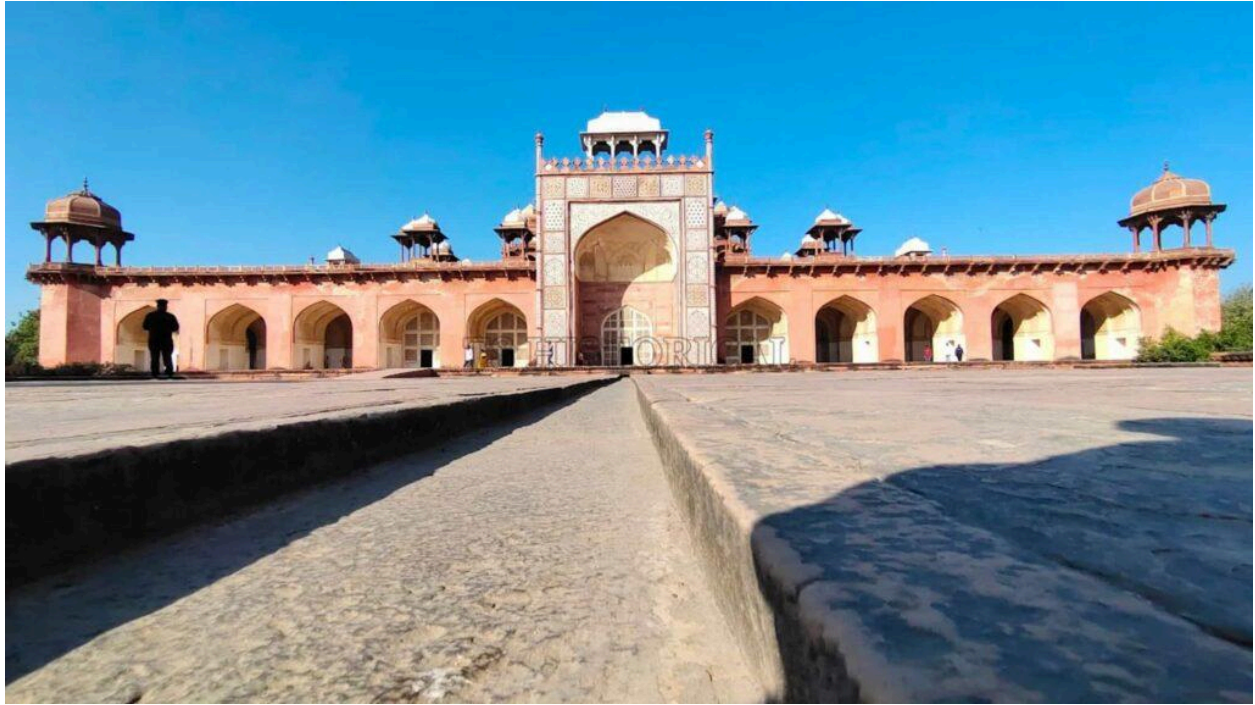
On 19th October 1546, after two years of her marriage, **Mariam Uz Zamani gave birth to twin sons, Mirza Hassan and Mirza Hussain**. Both of them died within a few days of their birth. **Mirza Hussain died** on 29 October 1564 and **Mirza Hassan died** on 5 November 1564. On 31 August 1569, the empress gave birth to On 31 August 1569, the empress gave birth to a boy who received the name, [Salim](#) and later who came to be known as [Jahangir](#), the **4th Sultan of India**.

## Marium-Uz-Zamani Death

On 19 May 1623, **Maryam-uz-Zamani died due to dysentery**, extremely rich and powerful, and due honor was given by burying her in a mausoleum close to that of an equally redoubtable man she was married to, Akbar. There is no concrete evidence stating the reason for death though it is believed to have been because of sickness.
